

# EHS Today continues its tradition of award-winning editorial

EHS Today was honored this year with five national and regional awards, including three editorial awards from the American Society of Business Press Editors (ASBPE), an editorial award from the Trade Association and Business Publications International (TABPI) and an APEX award for publishing excellence.

EHS Today's editorial and design staff has been honored with 15 regional, national and international awards in the last 6 years.



Executive Editor Sandy Smith's January 2009 editorial "R-E-S-P-E-C-T" was honored with a Tabbie award in the Trade Association and Business Publications International's b2b magazine competition, which is open to English-language business-to-business publications around the world. Nearly 500 editorial and design entries were received from across the globe, so winning this award is an impressive achievement.



Smith also was honored with a 2010 Azbee award from the American Society of Business Press Editors for editorial writing for her work in 2009. ASBPE's competition recognizes the hard work and commitment of business and professional magazine, newsletter and Web editors and designers. Thousands of entries were received, so being chosen for this award is a prestigious acknowledgement that the work has met high standards of excellence and that the recipients are at the top of their profession. Contributing Editor Jack Thornton also was honored with an Azbee in the case history category for his enlightening April 2009 article, "At Ford, Ergonomics Meets Immersive Engineering."



Senior Editor Laura Walter and Research Manager Christine Ramella-Burke have been honored twice this year. They received an Azbee for original research for their outstanding work on "The National Safety Survey: Can We Still Afford to be Safe?" which appeared in the August 2009 issue. They also received an APEX Award of Excellence for special purpose writing for the article. APEX awards recognize excellence in graphic design, editorial content and the success of the entry in achieving overall communications effectiveness and excellence. With over 3,700 entries, competition this year was exceptionally intense.



In addition to the editorial awards, Art Director Samantha Himes won an American Inhouse Design Award for the 2010 Media Guide. The American Inhouse Design Awards is the premier showcase for outstanding work by inhouse designers. These awards bring recognition to talented inhouse design, marketing and communications departments – within corporations, non-profits, publishers and media companies, associations, government, education and other institutions. Over 4,000 entries were submitted from various industries throughout the United States, making Himes' award particularly impressive.
